Brent Lanford reported that the Middle Georgia Regional Commission has been selected by the Carl Vinson Institute of Georgia's Information Technology Outreach Services (ITOS) as one of four Regional Commissions to provide GIS-based hazard mitigation analysis services under a pilot program with the Georgia Emergency Management Agency.

Approval from the council is requested to authorize MGRC to enter into contracts with ITOS to service as a sub-provider of HAZUS-MH services for Crawford and Putnam counties, initially and any additional counties identified by ITOS.

Mr. Williams also reported on several projects which were previously approved and have been completed.

• Our Workforce Development hosted OJT (On the Job Training) lunch and learn that was sponsored by Georgia Small Business Lenders. This sponsorship provided the opportunity to get in front of 20 small businesses and present our programs and what we do.

- The Area Agency on Aging has completed the SFY17 Senior Farmers Markets. This fiscal year the AAA served 712 individuals living in all eleven counties of the Middle Georgia Region.
- The City of Irwinton received a \$61,000 dollar USDA Grant for housing rehabilitation.
- Baldwin County received \$263,000 dollar FEMA Grant to fund three full-time fire-fighter positions
- The City of Jeffersonville received a Community Development Block Grant of \$299,100 for city-wide water and sewer improvements.
